Varnishing made easy

Quick start guide to varnishing your oil or acrylic painting

What you will need



Dry oil or acrylic painting



Flat bristle brush





Gamvar

First, check to make sure the thickest areas of your painting are dry and hard. If so, you're ready. *Lets varnish!*





Shake Gamvar, then pour into a bowl. (Pouring varnishes directly onto painting may lead to an uneven application or slow drying coat.)

2oz of Gamvar covers 40sq ft!



Dip your flat bristle brush into the bowl of Gamvar and scrub a small amount of Gamvar onto your painting. Once your entire painting has a thin coat (the thinner the better!), feather-out any brush marks. There's no need to clean your brush when you're finished. Just lay flat to dry.-

> That's it! Gamvar usually dries in 24 hours or less. Heat and humidity may slow dry time. If you ever want to

remove Gamvar, a soft cloth (like an old

t-shirt) with Gamsol will do the trick.
